These resources have been created to help your group explore Hadrian's Wall Gallery at the Great North Museum: Hancock.

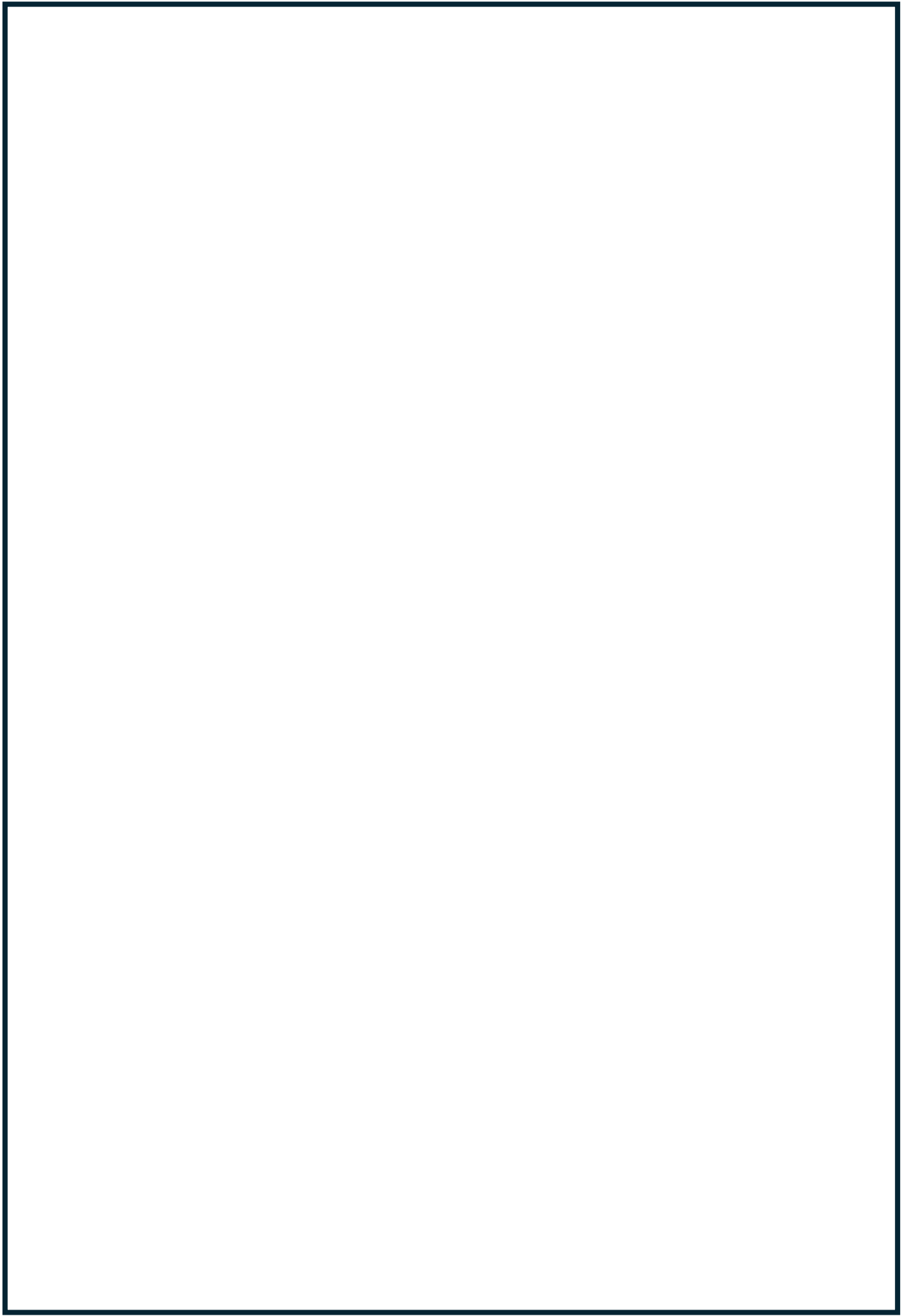
These resources can be used in groups or as individuals. You can also pick and choose from the resources to use. We suggest printing from page 3.

Complete your activity sheets to learn more about the Hadrian’s Wall gallery at the Great North Museum: Hancock.

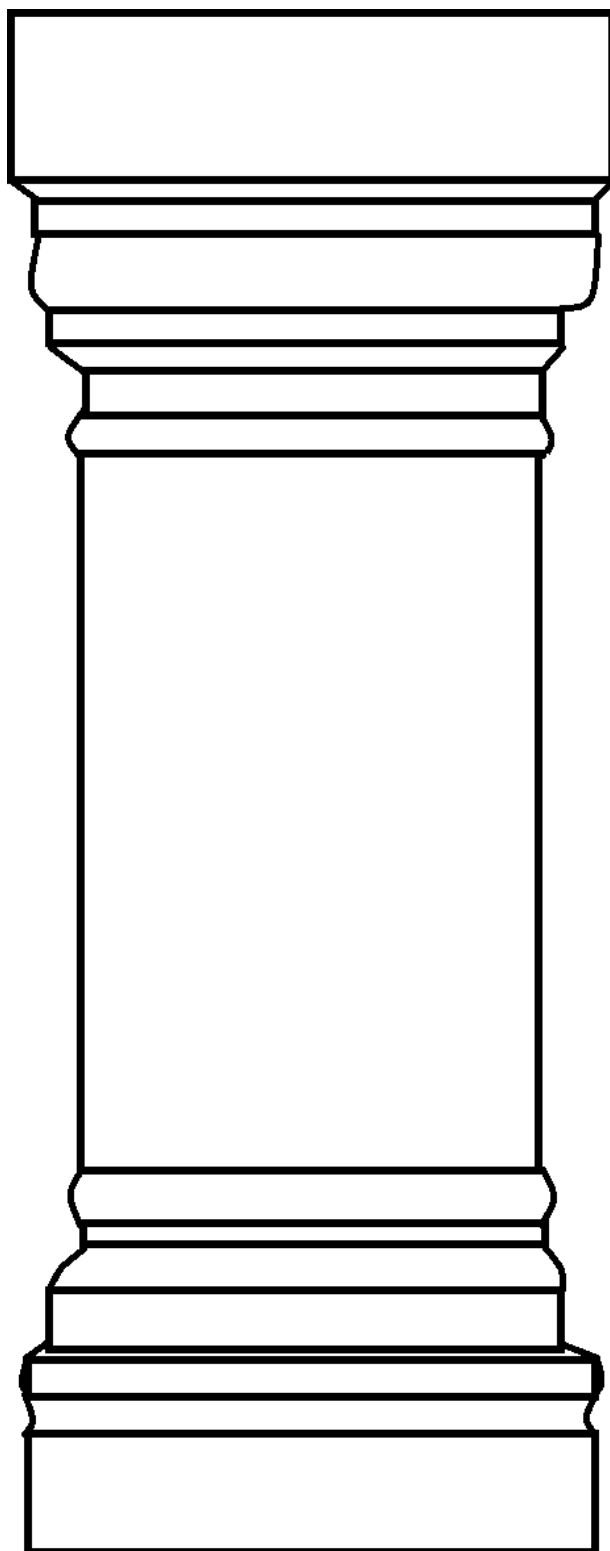
The Roman’s worshipped many gods and some of them were only worshipped around parts of Hadrian’s Wall.

Minerva	Oceanus	Mercury

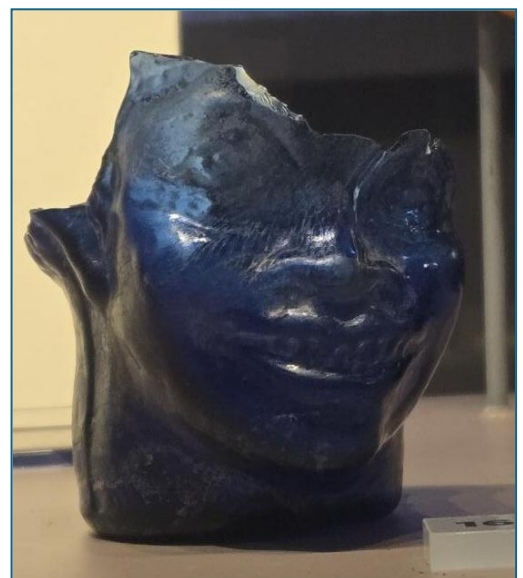
Design an Altar

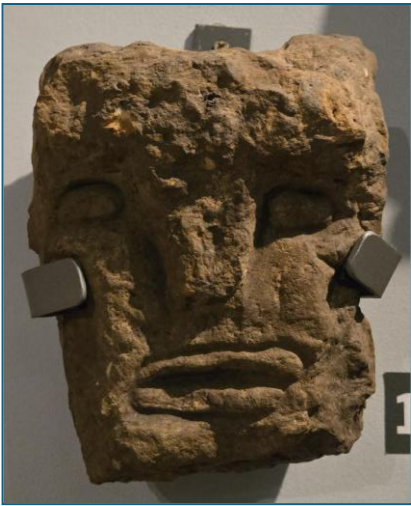
