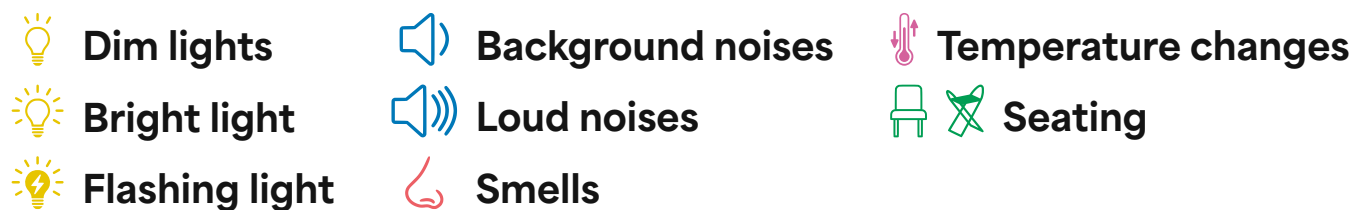
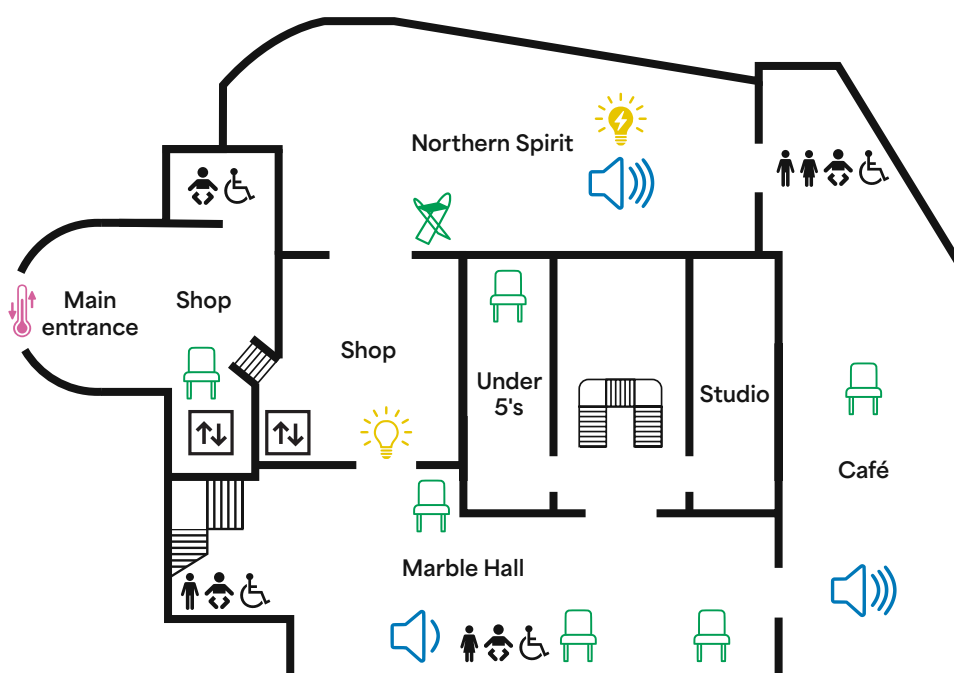

### Ground Floor



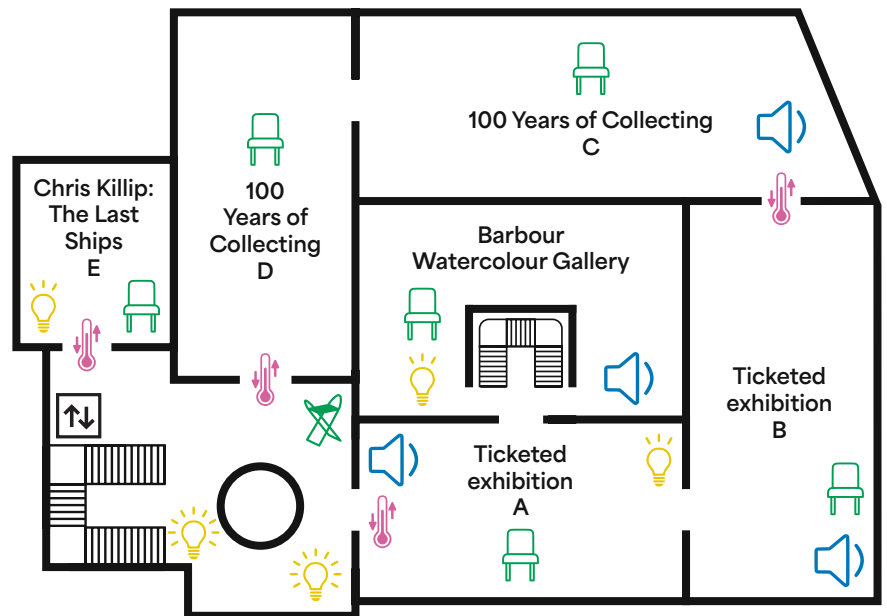
-  The Marble Hall and café toilets each have handdryers that produce a loud noise.
-  The café can be a busy space with loud noises from the kitchen, servery and visitors.
-  There is an interactive display in the middle of Northern Spirit that features thunderstorm sounds and flashing lights when activated.
-  Portable seats can be picked up on the ground floor from the Northern Spirit entrance.
- There could be a smell of cleaning products in the toilets.
- If needed, luggage, umbrellas and buggys can be stored at reception during your visit.
