Downstairs there is an arts and crafts shop, and a tourist information centre.



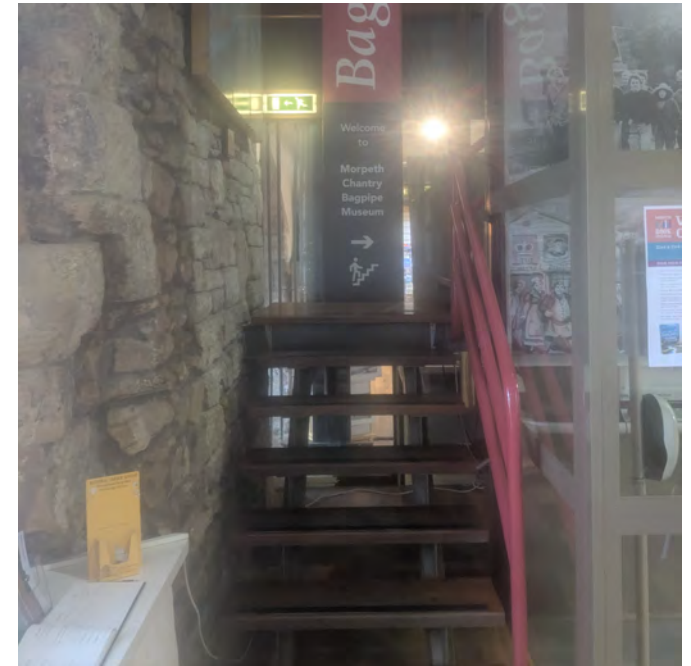
The staff who work there can answer any questions I might have.

if I need any help.

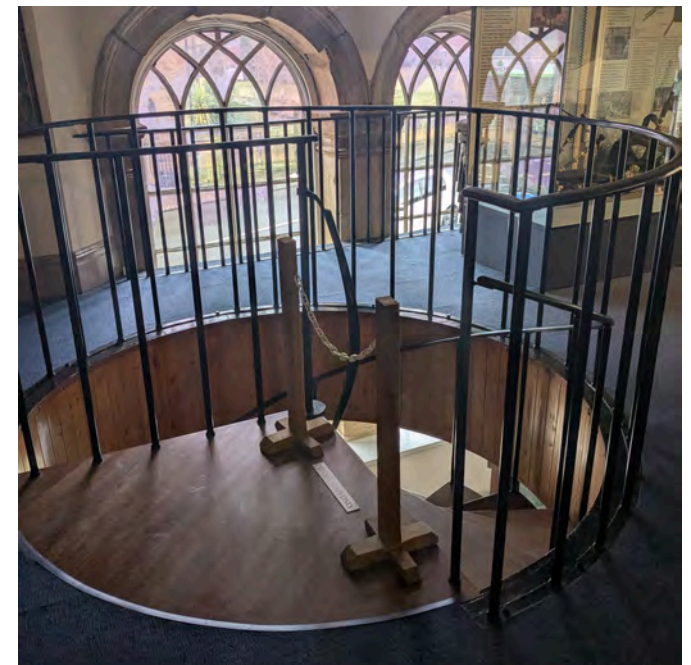


There is a mini museum with toys and bells to play with.
